

What is Stage 6 Dance?

- Dance in Year 11 & 12 is designed for students to experience, understand and value dance as an artform through the study of the performance, composition and appreciation of dance.
- Although Year 9 & 10 is not a prerequisite or requirement, Stage 6 builds upon the knowledge and skills learnt in previous years.
- Students who haven't had Dance as an elective in Stages 4 or 5, will not be disadvantaged if they choose Dance as an elective in Stage 6.
- Stage 6 Dance is an ATAR approved 2 Unit Course

How is Stage 6 Dance presented?

- Previously, due to small class sizes in our Diocese, Dance has not been available to interested students.
- Dance Teacher Miss Purnell, based at St Catherine's Catholic College in Singleton, has been running Stage 6 Dance in 6 different schools for the past three years.
- Through a combination of face-to-face and Video Conference lessons, as well as a detailed website, Miss Purnell has been able to run the elective that would not have been offered otherwise.





Performance Component

Core Performance – 20%

- 3-5 minute Dance choreographed by teacher
- 6 minute conversation discussing Safe Dance Practice in relation to Dance Technique and Performance Quality
- Process Diary internal assessments only

In Year 12, if you were to choose <u>Major Study</u> Performance, the intensity increases to;

- 4-6 minute Dance collaborative choreography
- 9 minute conversation body mechanics with Safe Dance, Technique and Performance Quality
- Process Diary internal assessments only
- 40% Task





Composition Component

Core Composition – 20%

- 3-5 minute Dance choreographed by Year 12 student and taught to another student at your school (you do not perform your own work you must have another student to perform it in the HSC. In Year 11 you will perform your own Composition Tasks).
- 6 minute conversation discussing the processes involved and what your work communicates
- 300 word rationale a written 'synopsis' handed to your examiners prior to your conversation and your work being performed by your student dancer
- Process Diary internal assessments only

Major Composition – 40%

- 4-6 minute Dance choreographed by student for 2-3 dancers (taught to dancers at your school you may be one of the dancers who perform)
 - Heavy focus on how you use 2-3 bodies in the space relationship between them
- 9 minute conversation discussing how you have generated movement and organised the movement/dance for a specific concept with 2-3 dancers
- 300 word rationale a written document handed to your examiners prior to your conversation and your work being performed by your student dancer
- Process Diary internal assessments only
- May use a prop to communicate meaning



Appreciation Component

Core Appreciation – 20%

- Time allowed: 1 hour plus 5 minutes reading time.
- There will be two extended response questions.
- Each question will be worth 10 marks.
- Each question will have an expected length of response of around three pages of an examination writing booklet

Major Study Appreciation – 40%

- Time allowed: 1 hour and 15 minutes plus 5 minutes reading time.
- There will be three extended response questions.
- Two extended response questions will each be worth 10 marks with an expected length of response of around three pages of an examination writing booklet
- One extended response question will be worth 20 marks with an expected length of response of around six pages of an examination writing booklet



Major Study – Dance & Technology


Option 1: Choreographing the Virtual Body

Candidates will create and choreograph a 'Work' of between four and six minutes duration for two to three dancers using computer-based animation software. Candidates will present the virtual choreography, and submit a 300 word rationale for their project. Candidates will have the opportunity to elaborate on their rationale and orally and physically demonstrate their applied knowledge and understanding of the compositional process.


Option 2: Film and Video

Candidates will create and choreograph a 'Work' of between four and six minutes duration for two to three dancers. Candidates will film and edit the 'Work', present the filmed and edited choreographed 'Work', and submit a 300 word rationale for their project. Candidates will have the opportunity to elaborate on their rationale and orally and physically demonstrate their applied knowledge and understanding of the compositional process.

** Choreographing for the Virtual Body is rarely/never done. You must have editing/filming experience and a strong desire for film, if you were to choose Film and Video.**
